Hoy - found 10 or 15 ^{to} at Madison
in the summer of 1838. Dr. Sandridge with
Wm. Lindsay was present - Alex. Cardwell
in Cardwell's new town. Most of them was a-
bout Rocky Springs at an early stage - just
for 10 or 12 months (to John) John Turner -
The best of the road was at the burning of
Lindsay Dutton's house on Dutton's house
at Rocky Springs - Sheriff Anderson, Jonathan
Gardner, John Anderson - Henry Southern, Abel S.
Lindsay - Chief - David Lindsay (of Basco) - I
rode up by myself - there were 15 or 20 - did not
know them all - They had some of ^{my} Price's stock
Anderson had ^{one} of his steers - he went to the
door of Lindsay Dutton's house - about
10 P.M. - Burst open the door and struck
one of the men with a piece of gunnail
There were three or four men fired - saw
Lindsay was shot in fact - then got him
outside of the house and whipped him -
There were two men an old one and a
young one they made the women take
the plunder except one straw bed and
bedstead - turned that up on the side &
set the house on fire -

white men ^{he} would quit -

My brother Thomas Smith was
along on the burning -

John A. Allen returned my
view one day and told me that he was
the sheriff here

I was with the crowd that went to burn
Judge, Dullens house - David Wilson

son where we were going but could
