John G. Jeffries, being first duly sworn
 deposes and says:

I joined the White Brotherhood in the Fall of 1868, near Sellers Mill in Alamance County, Camp No. 5, of which Albert Murray Sheriff of Alamance County was then the Chief - I was initiated in the Camp, the members all in disguise - I think there were eight or ten. I knew Sheriff Murray, James Anderson, George Mebane Juno. W. Long, John D. Gunt - he first mentioned the matter to me, Robert Moon who took me to the Camp. Hee was not in disguise - Henry Heurle, William Blanchard, Fred Blanchard, Sindsay Fonvielle, Arch. Sineberg Several of these were initiated that night. William Moore, James Dickey, John Roney, Wash. Fonvielle, John Hancock, Thomas Heurle, Ken Roney, Joe Roney, George Faucett, Jerry Sley - Reck Benj McAdams Jefferson Younger got Faucette Geo Watson Ed Pace Samuel Johnston George Patton John Vincent John King Daniel Warden I know to be members of the organization I was in the raid on Langford when he was whipped Thomas Williamson John Hancock Wm Faucette Fred A Blanchard

J. W. Louville ^{Lindsay} J. Louville James & Anderson
 who I think was in command ^{along} were disguised
 give him 39 lashes

I don't think I was in camp when the
 vote was taken to whip this man Langford
 but on the night we whipped him we met
 in camp and talked over the matter A Murray
 sheriff was present but did not go and
 aid in the whipping

I was in camp on one occasion when
 a vote was taken to whip a colored man
 by name Guy who was afterwards
 whipped and the parties I know engaged in
 this raid were Henry C. Hardle J. H. Anderson
 Fred Blanchard Thomas Mebane Geo Patton
 & others that I do not know we were all
 disguised give him a pretty severe whipping
 I heard Lindsay J. Louville say that he was
 in Graham on the night that Ngau Outlaw
 was hung that he ~~was~~ was not present
 when he was taken out of his house, but
 was present at the hanging

I think Zack Dickey was a member of
 the organization and I think was invited
 in our camp Jacob A. Long was ~~chief~~ chief of
 the county J. H. Anderson became chief of
 our camp after A. Murray declined to act
 we had some instructions from the chief
 of the county that a raid was to be made

in the town of ~~Graham~~ which was
done in the early spring of 1869

In the Fall of 1869 I think A. Munday Chiff
resigned as chief of our ~~Camp~~

James W. Anderson who told me he was in
the raid in Graham at the time mentioned
and further affiant saith not
