Yours of 17th inst recd this morning -  
 In reply will say -  
 As regards hiring the floor - you are aware that  
 we pay one half the expense on lease -  
 As to not furnishing full line of goods - We proposed  
 to do so if you at once directed us to send only  
 what you ordered. All these sent so many of disordered  
 doubling orders that we could only fill them by  
 instalments - It has cost us at least 1000 - to  
 make patterns for handles which you have sent  
 little orders for - which have never paid at all -  
 As to the being "all books" to be copied from Hell  
 to Purgatory & back three times a week it depends  
 entirely on the printing - We don't see it in that light.
