I am truly thankful for the "character" you have given me - and the more so as it is given without my asking for it - thus far I have had no work of such a thing but it may still be useful to me - I also thank you for your often too wished me - I have managed to keep myself above water thus far - don't know how long I will be able to do so - I have made a little speculating in bonds - and have sold some cigars and made a little on them - made \$200 yesterday & got today just work which I speak - I think that if it was not such infernally hard

times that I could do pretty well  
in the cigar trade, - I have quite a  
number of customers and a good many  
more have promised me their orders,  
I get 10 per cent. commission on all  
sales. I cannot say that I fancy  
selling cigars but anything is  
better than standing. I have had  
a chance for a situation but have  
been trying to get some agencies  
and if I can do so I prefer to be  
my own boss. I feel almost confident  
that I shall at least get one agency  
from a spoke man's firm which still am  
not certain of that. Drudope of the  
old D. & L. Mfg. Co. has rented a large  
building on Beekman St. and told me  
this P.M. that if I wanted to store three  
hundred boxes he would take them and  
not charge any storage. I had an  
offer from a party here to buy all  
the stock at 118 Chambers St. at 50%

60 days - I submitted this matter to  
W. & F. and they said "instead of sixty  
days pay cash" and offer is accepted  
I need not cash - Shattuck offered  
50% - 6 mo note, and need not  
make any better offer - he knows the  
stock has to be moved by 1<sup>st</sup> Oct.  
think if I do not sell it before that  
time that the W. & F. will consign it  
to him - and he thinks he can make  
more out of it - Green also thinks  
that it will be consigned to him  
and he will consequently not make  
any good offer for it. I wrote to W. & F.  
tonight and explained the whole matter  
to them and asked them to let me  
take the goods to Drudope and that I  
feel certain of realizing more for them  
and also for me - then would be done if  
they consigned them to Shattuck. It would  
be about like us when we were  
consigning goods to Shattuck, he would
