Dear Sir

I wish to acknowledge your kind
letter ^{of 14th Oct} and to thank you for some and by
product far not answering before this I
being intended to write you before but as I had
no particular subject to write about but merely
to get a little better acquainted with each other
and a common fellow like me to write
to a Judge of course I naturally feel a little
timid however you will please overlook any
mistakes I may make for this time. I
I may say here that we naturally feel a little
proud to hear that one of our Cousins is
a Dr & the other a Judge - and this being the case
we are not ashamed of our name altho we
don't all spell our names the same may get
very well round a little freely we think
we spell it correct. I am sure however there
is no doubt but we are Cousins & altho
we don't spell ^{our} names the same
My Father Phillip Frazier is here with me
and you will his Brother - Ved continue he
says

He Remembers very well went to Little in Ohio
he being the oldest & my Father the youngest
of the family it would appear that your Grand
Father was my Father's Brother and Consequ-
ently your Father & myself are Cousins and
I suppose you & me would be distant Cousins
when you mention Valentine thus Phillip and
Nabby the names are all familiar to us
lived near Churchville about 12 miles west of
Rochester Monroe Co^{and} died there leaving two or
three sons Alanson & Orville George & have
seen the former now lives in Rochester and the
latter has moved to Michigan
my Grandfather was an officer in the Revolution
war the man who wrote to your Father about
twenty years since & his name was Alanson of
Churchville 12 miles west of Rochester as he stated
to us that he wrote you & that about that same
time he had been here to see us he was in
the hardware business
I heard of your being in Rochester stopping
for Grant a friend of mine had you and sent
me a paper containing permission about your
speech but of course you had gone further
where we got the notice
I believe our family descended from Peter George
I have one son & two sisters living about twenty

miles west of her and my Father and one
sister lives in this town my Mother
died some 20 years ago this place
is about half way between Kingston and
Toronto I have been in this place about
forty years I am 61 years old will be 62
in June I have a daughter married to Andrew
Laird living in Columbus Ohio if you
should happen to be in that city they would
be glad to see you I sent them your letter
and they have returned it to me again
my wife was away in Columbus some
two years since and says she passed
through Kingston where your Father
lives
we had about the Book Jannetta you spoke
about and intend to send for a copy we strongly
suspect it was written by Judge Jones
I send you Father's Photograph some-
other time I will Lilly send my name
would be pleased to have yours I have
Dr Evans Photo
my sister wrote letter to your Father and
enclosed a Photo of her
It will be pleased to hear from you at any time
and more please to see you soon
