My dear Husband.

I was glad to hear of your good luck personally if you had no political good news to tell. I would indeed like to hear you when you get off those brilliant flashes. I believe I have never been so fortunate.

But I saw this morning and seemed quite gratified that you remembered to send the general news.

I saw Mr Gregory to day and send you enclosed the court calendar as he desired. He was very much in hopes you would get away so as to come up next week to attend to some of the cases. He said the State Ticket had been nothing. He did not think there had been \$20. in fees paid to the whole bar.

One of your men of Holt, Saylor. He was arrested yesterday for obtaining goods under false pretenses. He was released on bail. He seemed to think it would go hard with him.

Will you be home for Sunday? I am afraid not if you come up next week during court and it would hardly pay, though I would like you to come so much. Do you think you will get off to attend Chatham Court the week after? I was disappointed in not getting the papers this morning, but sure and send them every day. I am glad Foinette is doing so well there. You may well enough to pay expenses I think it very strange that we have not heard from Atlanta since I wrote to Dr Fuller.

We are all quite well and doing well. Annie has been earnestly for her dear papa every night that naughty men won't hurt him. She sends you a kiss.
