

Tourgee's Alleged Overissue of Stock.

NEW YORK, Nov. 20.—[Special]—A recent issue of the New York Sun contained the following which may be of interest in Chautauqua county: "The case of William D. Holmes against Our Continent Publishing company was on trial yesterday before Judge Andrews and a jury in the Supreme court. The matter involved an alleged overissue of stock by ex-Judge Albion W. Tourgee, President of Our Continent Publishing company, and the action was brought to recover back the money which Mr. Holmes had paid for the stock of such overissue. The jury gave a verdict to Mr. Holmes for \$13,000 and interest and costs.

Novel Attempt at Suicide.

A man living in Corry attempted to commit suicide a few days ago in a novel manner. He forced a carrot, measuring nine inches in circumference at the top and five inches in length, into his bowels. Dr. M. Pickett, who was called to attend the case, worked nearly three hours in removing it. During all that time the patient was kept under the influence of ether. Dr. Pickett will report the case in the medical journals.
