My Dear:

Dunham has been with me for two hours. He takes A. Fowl's Paraline - or whatever I choose to call it at 15 per cent here and $7\frac{1}{2}$ in England. He also goes over 'D' again and will let me know his conclusions on Thursday. Have not seen a ~~word~~^{hair} on heard a word of Henry. Have no notion whether he is dead or alive. Have used a lot of L to K and done a lot of correspondence. Don't know whether I shall get a way tonight or tomorrow night. Wrote Lippincott to send check as usual this morning. Just here your telegram

two letters and package
received. God bless you
Love. I am much better to
stay and think I will stay
here for another day's rest.
Make the engagements. I have
started to mend and will
be all right now.

I telegraphed at once about
the Benetton's draft and
will write again tonight
for the Hippinott to be sent.
Too bad. They only paid
me as I was going to the
train and I gave the man
\$50 and told him to send
draft, and left him a
letter for you in which
to enclose it. You will

probably get it tonight.
I would send you check
from here but cannot spare
it. Better have dog
killed and skinned. There
is no use in trying to help
him live in pain. Poor
fellow, it is a pity but
it will be mercy to him
no doubt.
