as the public money is out and we are very anxious to have our school go on a little longer it would be quite a help to us if you think you and your friends could aid us to the smallest amount. I do not want to be burden some to you and trust I may not be. but knowing that you have the interest of the poor

colored people at least and
believing that you will do something
for us. I write as I do I trust
that the plea I am making
in behalf of the ignorant and poor
people of this town may come up
before and we shall be able to
come on the good work a little
longer. we would not come to
you but as we had to pay for our
school house and this has cut us
short so if you can help us but
a little it will do us good hope
you can help us one month
which is \$5 dollars and you will
have the thanks and blessings
that one can ask the Heavenly
father who has all to let some
fall on you and your household
hoping to hear from you soon
