

Lake Linden Mich.
Jun 15th 1889.

My dear wife: I am staying here over
Sunday with Mr Scoggin the Capt
of the Culvermet and Hecla Mines.
He has given me some beautiful
specimens which I hope to get through
safe to your son Loder rather but
am afraid I shall fail.

It is a delightful family and
the mill and mines are stupendous
things. I have just written Mearns
about the Forman which begging
him to put it off a month if he
can. Have not yet heard from
Slayton about the California
matter but he telegraphs that

I will get a letter at DePueing.

This is wavy out of the world
and as it is raining now
I am not sure that I shall
get out at all.

Sent you a draft yesterday
for \$100. Telegraph when
received as I am fearful it
may get delayed or even
cribbed. I don't know why.

Lost my overcoat on Friday
and had to buy another yesterday.
I shall stay here until to-
morrow morning at

seven or — and hope
to get to Ashprey about
1 P.M. —

I trust you are having a very
good time and wish to trans-
mit lots of love to Lizzie

She must write to Mr.
Coggin when she gets the
specimens + I will enclose
his name. They are de-
lightful people and of course
— rich!
