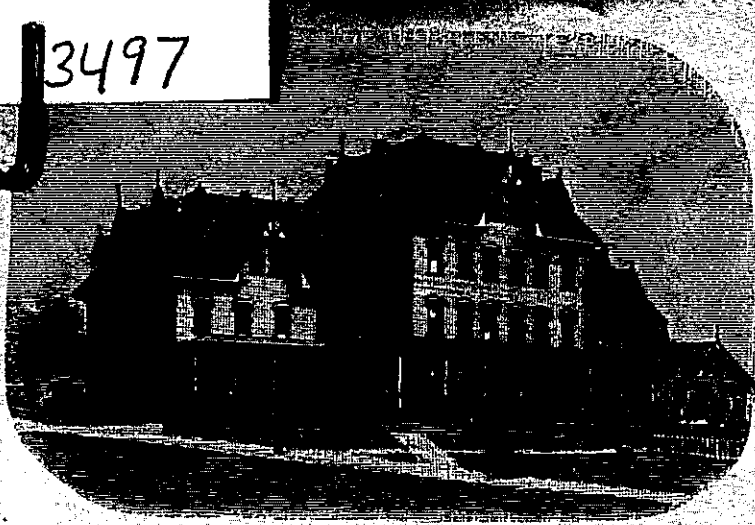

Ishpeming, Mich. June 14th 1889

My dear wife:

I rec'd your letter of the 12th on my arrival here today. Telegram just rec'd from Slayton Spots, Uyannee Mich. on the 17th and Berlin Wis, on the 18th with Beaver Falls Pa on the 29th

This you see breaks up my time so that I really don't have any of any account until after tomorrow. I think I will run two or three days about that time and may be as many more afterward. It is awful close however — awful close. I don't know what I am to do, I'm sure.

I am glad you are happy. Of course I can't understand it! Between Bill and Phila, I should unquestionably prefer the former. Slayton was to have written me here about the California trip but there is no letter from him.

There are all mines here — iron with gold just northward of the place — but I do not see that I am likely to get any specimens. Nobody who has life enough to secure

such a thing for me has yet
turned up. I have very easy trips
for tomorrow and two following
days. Then I expect a pretty clean
one to Berlin. I guess I will have my
mail sent up to Milwaukee instead
of going down to Chicago, but have
not yet determined.

Had a very pleasant time at
Mr. Coggins's but concluded to put the
specimens in my trunk instead of hav-
ing them exposed. Shall try and
do my Byström tomorrow but
am shockingly demoralized and
do not know what I shall
get through.
