I was disappointed at getting no letter or telegram from you here. My cold is somewhat better than last night but I am very much shocked up and do not feel very lively.

It is very fortunate the trip is no longer. I have on my last shirt and am about worn out. It did not seem a very hard route but somehow I am awfully tattered out by it. So far as I can now see I shall reach Mayville on the 25<sup>th</sup> (Friday) at 11 at night and leave there on the 29<sup>th</sup> (Tuesday) at 11 A.M. for Beaver Falls.

I dread Cornston. For the rest I do not care.

I have just got the letters. I do not know why but I have had a hard time in finding them. A lady ought never to be the committer. I am not sure that it

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would not be wise any how  
to send your letters to the  
towns and not in care of any  
one.

I have read the letters and  
will answer some of them today.  
If you had observed my letters you  
would have seen that I had no  
"off-time" as you seem to think.  
Bertha having been put on the 9th  
I would rather ride 1000 miles to be  
at home over Sunday than spend 4  
days at some hotel alone. I think  
I should die. I simply cannot do  
that sort of thing. A city is no more  
company to me than a jail. I am  
fairly contented any where with some  
of my home folks with me but  
perfectly desperate alone.

I shall see Ripon and Clayton  
in Chicago, and will know more  
or less about the future when I

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less there, than I do now.

I am glad you are so happy but am a little sore that you should be so elated over others compliments while you have so steadily ignored mine for so long. Be as happy as you can however. That is all that is left us.
