Dear Mrs. Tourgee,

We enclose a letter from the Judge. He says he can not make Pottsdam from Cedar Falls, but he can make it, and have twelve hours to spare very easily. We fixed the dates there for Mar. 15th and 16th, because they could not take the 25th and 26th. We wrote Judge Tourgee to that effect, and told him that he could make it easily. We did not look up the connections at the time, thinking it unnecessary, because there was plenty of time to spare. He can be at Buffalo, N.Y. on the morning of the 14th at 7.30 A.M., leaving here at 5.30 the night previous, reaching Chicago from Cedar Falls at 2.30 P.M. on the 13th.

As we wrote you in a previous letter, as we understand it the check which was protested has not been paid.
