Of course, I am tired and jugged but went out this morning to chase a jack rabbit - and the sport did not rest me any. I leave tonight at 5:40, go to Kansas City and get to Emporia where I hope to find my trunk at 2 p.m. tomorrow.

I am so sorry you had such a bad day yesterday. I like the Inaugural and look for a good administration. I think he will have

a good many difficulties and after
a year or so will be glad to have
some new friends.

I hope the rain held up for the
ball so that everything was not absolutely
a big drizzle; but I guess you have
both got about enough of inaugural
ceremonies. It is worth trying to see for
once, not any more. I trust you did
not catch of you get cold and will
be well when you get rested.

I wish you would have the Doctor
express to me at Mayville a dozen
or so of artificial eyes to meet me
on my arrival, about the 14 or 15th
inst. I am afraid this one I have will
give out before that time even. I may
try for one in Chicago but as my time
there is very limited it is hardly prob-
able that I will be able to suit my-
self. I have to go and meet some
ladies at the Library Club as they
call it pretty soon and must be
