Having a very bad time. I do not think it was anything unusual about it but is just a hemorrhage. It terrifies me that you leave it. It is especially bad that it comes now, but I suppose the rain today and consequent wind, if not continued rain tomorrow will do a good deal towards reconciling you to your disappointment. I am very glad you did not try to come when you were not able.

I will stay here quietly and write my story; am very pleasantly located and as my expenses are paid here will stay as long as I can. Kiss Lodie for me.
