Dear Brother

Pardon the liberty
I take but I have wanted to
write you ever since I heard
your lecture last summer at
Chautauque. ~~That~~ that enthusiastic
crowd was very tame in their
cheers for you. It surprised me to
find that your true words
were not popular at the North.
I have been in the work among
the colored people of the South
since 1863. For the last 12 years
have been in the employ of the
above Society. My work has been
mostly in the homes of the people
much of the time on the Plant
of La. I write to ask for

your books when first written
I read "Hool's Corand" & "Books
without Straw" & they are the
only ones I have ever seen. I
get but-little time to read, this
work is so absorbing. I enclose
one of the papers I have been edit-
ing for the last four years for the
col. people. Last winter I tried
a school for Married Women It
is the right-thing I am sure
help me pray that God may send me
the means to carry it forward I
enclose a scrap showing a little
of the "why". But I feel you are too
busy to care for this I do not know
the price of your books I enclose
\$61 It will likely pay for the one you
think will help me most -
