Hon. A. W. Tourgee,

My Dear Judge:-

Yours of the 9th inst. is received and I note what you say relative to the application of the \$1130 allowed for the horses and carriage. I think you are correct in your recollection of the matter but I had forgotten the conversation until it was recalled by your letter.

We are willing to make it as you suggest and will take up the \$130 note as of Jan'y. 14th, 1889, and apply \$1,000 at that date on the bond and mortgage, leaving \$4,000 due Jan'y. 14th, 1889.

I enclose statement which shows the amount collected on "Buttons Inn" and the Kansas land and the application made of it, by which you will see that all interest on the mortgage is paid to Jan'y. 14th, 1889 and there is a balance of \$2.06 to the credit of "Buttons Inn." It will be satisfactory to us if you pay the \$75 note, and interest to date, and the interest on the \$130 note to Jan'y. 14th from the new loan to be made you. We will carry the \$250 note longer, hoping that the returns from "Letters to the King", now due, will materially reduce the balance on that.

When you have made assignment of the contracts and new notes, as

suggested by you in your letter of June 21st, send them all to me and I will instruct Mr. Cipperly relative to the matter.

Would it not be proper also for Mrs. Tourges to send me a receipted bill of sale for the horses and carriage, and I will endorse \$1,000 on the bond and mortgage as of Jan'y. 14th, 1889, and pay the \$150 note at that date.
