NEW YORK, August 1st, 1889.

COMRADE :

The next Reunion of the above regiments will be held at Seneca Falls, N. Y., Wednesday and Thursday, September 4th and 5th. The comrades living at Seneca Falls promise to make this the grandest reunion held since the close of the war.

The first day (Wednesday) there will be a Reception and Business Meeting at 1.30 P. M., and in the evening there will be a Camp Fire, under the auspices of Cross Post, No. 78, G. A. R., instead of the customary banquet, at which addresses will be made by volunteer speakers. No list of toasts will be prepared.

For the second day there will be an excursion to Cayuga Lake Park, three miles distant, and in the afternoon there will be a parade of the Seneca Falls Fire Department and visiting companies in honor of the Association. The Seneca Falls Fire Department is second to none in the State.

The Headquarters of the Association will be at the Hoag House, where the comrades will report immediately on their arrival, register their names with the Secretary, and obtain badge, and tickets for the Excursion and Camp Fire, the latter being generously provided by the citizens and comrades of Seneca Falls without expense to visiting comrades.

The Hotels will entertain comrades and their friends at \$1.50 per day.

The officers of the Association have not made any arrangement for reduced fare on the railroads. This matter will be left in the hands of committees in the several localities, and it is expected that favorable rates will be secured from Binghamton, Elmira, Buffalo, Rochester and other points. Comrades in these places should take steps to secure them at once.

Seneca Falls is on the New York Central R. R., between Syracuse and Rochester. Parties from Binghamton and points East on Erie or D., L. & W., go by Syracuse to Seneca Falls; parties from Elmira and vicinity connect at Geneva, via Fall Brook R. R., or at Canandaigua, via Northern Central; those on railroads running from Erie road come to Central at Auburn (Lehigh Valley) at Cayuga, Geneva, or at Canandaigua.

It is hoped that enough of the comrades will pay their dues this year to provide for printing the proceedings of the last and of the coming reunion. Hereafter the printed proceedings will be sent only to those who have paid their dues.

The annual dues are \$1.00. Comrades who cannot be present at this meeting should send their dues to the Secretary, who will forward their receipt by mail.

Gen. Geo. M. Guion, who was elected President last year, being unable to serve, Gen. Slocum has consented to hold over another year, and has promised to be present and preside at this meeting.

At the last meeting of the Association a badge was adopted, of which the above is a full size cut. The design shows the corps in which each regiment of the Association served, with their official designation lettered thereon. It is made of metal, heavily electro-gold plated, and will be furnished at the following low prices :
