The Survivors' Association.

The next reunion of this association, composed of the 27th New York Volunteers, the 1st New York Veteran cavalry and the 33d New York volunteers, will be held in Seneca Falls on Wednesday and Thursday, September 4th and 5th. On the first day there will be a reception and business meeting at 1:30 P. M., and in the evening there is to be a camp-fire under the auspices of Cross Post, No. 78, G. A. R., of this village, instead of the customary banquet, at which addresses will be made by volunteer speakers. No list of toasts will be prepared. For the second day there will be an excursion to Cayuga Lake park, and a parade by the Seneca Falls Fire department. The headquarters of the association will be at the Hoag house. Gen. Henry W. Slocum of Brooklyn will be present and preside at the meeting. Major J. Marshall Guion is chairman of the local committee.
