Yours of the 18th inst. is received, enclosing copy of contract with the Lippincotts for the publication of "Gauge and Swallow", and assignment of the same to me. I enclose herewith check \$100 for same.

In this connection, it occurs to me that you wrote me last spring, sending partial return from Cranston & Stowe on account of "Letters to a King" and said that there would be a farther remittance when you had adjusted a certain account for books with them.
