Bartlett and a number of the Regimental and Line officers. One chapter is devoted to the account of Ten Months Experience in Southern Prisons, and gives cuts of three prisons, and the names of many of the comrades who died in prison.

The Roster is a correct copy of the Muster-out Roll, and gives the name of every man who enlisted in the Regiment.
