

Copy of the Affidavit of John G. Hazeltine

I have been acquainted with John G. Spencer for a period of two or three years before he enlisted. And we were both members of the same Regiment - the 105: O.V.I. about the 10<sup>th</sup> of September 1862, on the return to Camp from Grand Review at Louisville Ky. I was in the rear guard and in the afternoon and the day was very warm. At a stone quarry I noticed that a number of persons had collected around some one and I stopped to see who it was and found John G. Spencer prostrated by Sunstroke which I immediately reported to Lieutenant Tourgee who was in command of the rear guard on that day. He ordered me to go back and stay with ~~him~~ Spencer until I could bring him into camp which I did. Taking him in about Sun down of the same day.
