Dear Mr. Dourges.

Have you received statement of Af. from A. Williams & Co.? I have been on claim heels ever since you wrote last, with promises and excuses every other day. Today I sent a messenger to Neatherly instructed to say he was to stay there until it was made out and given to him. He came back saying Neatherly said it was forwarded direct on a letter from the Judge yesterday. but if it wasn't it would be today!"

Looked out for them. They had 1st edition of my NC maps, 300. of them. After trying in vain for a year to get a Settlement I took away what could be found, 21 short. Sent them for the balance and got back, on the theory that I probably stole my own maps. They have over \$2000. suspended for 8 years, without pay. In common life phrase Harrell is a thief and liar and Neatherly hasn't nerve enough to say "brave." I don't believe a word of their story.

My confirmation hangs fire yet. "Loge" Upchurch & Ellison  
are doing their best. What will come of it I do not know.  
Ask the Judge to read the inclosed and send it back to me  
with opinion whether I ought to forward it. The contents  
of the "memorial" are all in the 2nd paragraph, condensed.  
The citizens here, Dem & Rep - offer to take my confirm-  
ation in hand and send up a big memorial - but I  
do not like to admit the necessity or obligation.  
It is humiliating. I wish you had sent me a copy  
of the letter to Hawley - so I could know what he had, and  
infer what he would probably do. He and Ransom are the only  
parties in the Senate taking any active interest. I can buy  
Ransom with a few to Busby, but I don't want to do that.  
Busby is too willing to suit me.

All well, yet, and all send love - Let me know if  
a W & Co have not sent statement.
