Excuse I think by the  
by the reading of your letter that  
<sup>fine</sup> Pone is a borrowing a good deal  
of trouble for nothing. I rented the  
House for one dollar a month  
and ~~some~~ of the neighbors tried  
to have Her move out last fall  
as I would be out that much  
rent & as soon as they heard that  
Mr. Hetcher was about buying they  
told her she would have to get  
right out - as Hetcher was going  
to move in at once. I understood  
that he did not want to move  
out till his feed gave out where  
he was & I told Her to stay  
till I notified her or till the  
first of April & I told those  
parties that I guessed I could

hold the place till the first of  
april or may as I did  
not think it any of their  
business any way they said  
that Felcher was going to  
work the sugar camp & I said  
I guess not as I should  
work it my self this is all  
there is to it I have not  
seen Mr Felcher nor has  
he said a word about it till  
till yesterday then I inquired  
if He had bought the place  
and when He wanted to  
move in and he said  
not till His feed gave out  
I have no objection to  
his taking possession any  
time But I did suppose  
I had a rite to use the  
sugar camp this year &  
I think it would not be

quite square to cut me  
down to nine months  
for one years rent paid  
in advance without it  
In regard to the wood  
I have cut no wood on  
the place nor have I intend  
to. When I built the  
west line fence over there  
was old pieces of rails & other  
trash that I got out of  
the fence row & piled up I  
& Hauled it off the first of this  
week but the lord knows  
they can have that if they  
want it. As for the  
Lawyers fee I dont see  
as there is any necessity of it  
or a great deal of pleasure  
for you or I either but  
it appears as tho some  
one is getting pleasure
