Volume 20 of the Proceedings of the Society of the Army of the Cumberland, now in press, will soon be ready for delivery to all members of the Society who have paid dues for the year 1889. Such dues, amounting to *Five Dollars*, became payable at the time of the Chattanooga meeting last September. Upon examining the Treasurer's books I find that you owe for the year 1889, and that notice of such dues being payable has not yet been sent to you.
