My dear Husband:

Your sweet

letter of yesterday morning was  
on the table when I went

down to breakfast. I am glad

you got yourself up "stiff" and

staid for the occasion, and

it was too bad we had to be sep-

arated. You are wrong about

the years though. You have

had one more year of hopping

than you take account of.

The eventful day, was

May 1863, - and it is now

May 1890, - we have been

married 27 years, you see.

But I'll forgive you this time -  
take it all off you

or trying to be forgotten  
about the "Angelus". It does  
not seem possible that he  
could have been in earnest  
as long as I almost must  
know the history of this famous  
biskare. I am a bishop, of  
account of the big price  
paid for it, than for any  
thing else. There is a version  
at Enck's which every body  
is going to see, but I did  
not see so much in it.  
Miss Emily wanted Lizzie  
to go to New York Saturday  
instead of going to Austin  
City, as there were two exhibitions  
of pictures, one of "Old Masters",  
on that day, but she is not  
strong enough for such a  
drive - it would tire her  
out so she would not be

able to be up a gain for a  
week. I found from experience  
how tiresome a trip to New York  
and back is in one day. Let  
alone doing two lecture gal-  
eries. So I set down on the  
option at once. She thinks  
she would prefer to stay  
at home than go to Atlantic  
City, but I have not decided  
that was best for her. I have  
been very busy mending  
and fixing up Annie's clothes  
all the morning. It has rained  
hard, and I had to go up to  
Miss Wilson's to get some letters  
done, and the time has slipped  
away. At 2, Annie has an ap-  
pointment with Dr. Fiske, and  
I am going down with her.  
This week take the afternoon

and I thought I better  
take it for a couple more  
I am anxious to get mail  
the winter get around the  
next night. I am sorry, though  
mine written yesterday was  
mailed so late I am afraid  
you will not get it tonight  
I have cleaned up a little  
but I don't trust the weather  
to hold so long, perhaps  
for some time must stop  
writing but I hope you  
will be all right
