On submitting the same to Judge Lounger he informs me that in his opinion the objections made to your breeching are insuperable except by his process. He advises me to say to you that I will under no circumstances grant a shop right to manufacture in any other manner being fully satisfied that the repeated failure of cast breeching and other parts of a harness for the reasons offered by your objectors, show that

even experimental production of the same under claim of license from his patentee would be of damage to my right.

As he has experimented on this matter for ten years expending many thousand dollars in ~~the~~ determining the capabilities of materials and processes and has now pending several more patents on the matter, I regard him as knowing more about the subject than any living man. This view is strengthened by the fact that he is
