then and there being a passenger of the colored race on a train of the Louisville & Nashville Railway Company, the said Louisville and Nashville Railway Company, then and there being a railway company engaged in carrying passengers in its coaches in the State of Louisiana, a law had been enacted prior to going into and maintaining in a coach to which space to the said Daniel F. Woodard did not belong to sit a coach assigned to passengers of the white race, there being at the time aforesaid two or more passenger coaches attached to said train and affording equal but separate accommodations for persons of the white and colored races.
