I enclose 1\$ for Pactolos Prime, for from what I have heard of the book it relates my experience. I have been a salve, sold for 1000\$ at New Orleans, after the fall of Sumpter sent South to prevent learning my letters, placed in prison because I wanted to learn, a run-a-way hid under an outhouse with hounds after me, following the army during the farst of the war, enlisting in the Navy advanced to a first class petty officer, finally entering the U.S.Army as a commissioned officer ranking the son of my mother's maxterx former master, etc.
