Dear Sister, ---I took your will and the letter you wrote in connection with it to a first-class lawyer, and he has fixed it up in proper shape to make it legal and perfectly safe. He obtained the name of the corporation of which Judge Tourgee is president, which was necessary in order to make the document legal. It took some little time for correspondence, but thought it best to have it right while we were about it. He stated it was better to draw the will over and dispense with the old one. All you have to do is to write in the date, and sign your name before the word seal, and have two witnesses sign in the blank below, filling in the date in the blank space left for that purpose. That will make the document perfectly good.

It may be interesting to you to know that our Home work is steadily increasing in importance and usefulness. The most painful part of our work is to be obliged to refuse to relieve cases that are real worthy and needy, but we are looking for better days and the means to carry forward the work on a much larger scale.
