in any constitution.
- 3 - That a right once granted to a  
citizen cannot be lawfully taken

civil privileges and the untrammeled  
<sup>and efficient</sup> exercise of the voter's  
~~franchise~~ <sup>elective franchise</sup> are vital to the  
permanency and prosperity of  
any republic.
- 6 - That <sup>the Nation</sup> has the <sup>power</sup> right and it is its  
burden duty to protect its citi-
