Dear Mrs. Tourgee:-

we send you herein statements of the sales of all the Judge's books up to January 1st.

The "Caesar" account shows a vast credit balance of \$15.28. This is the first time the account has shown anything to the credit and the question arises, how shall we dispose of the amount? *Our* recollection is that the net proceeds were to be divided among half a dozen different parties, among whom was Mr. Blair. *We* presume that he will not be entitled to his share now, and possibly that should be divided

pro rata among the others. Please let me know what your feeling is about it. The account is probably not large enough to cause any squabbling among the beneficiaries.
