the morning. The defeat  
of our party in the last  
campaign was considerable  
of a surprise to me and  
I suppose to a great many  
thinking men. But if we  
have health strength and  
good leaders four years  
hence. I am of the opinion  
that the Republican party  
will gain a victory which  
will far surpass four yrs.  
ago. The republicans here are  
very quiet as to who they

will put forward as a  
candidate for Mayor.  
on the Democratic side

between <sup>Cate</sup> Harrison, Wash.

strings, which undoubtedly  
either one will have to  
break. In my opinion the  
last election was caused  
by a great many Mrs. Trumps  
as it was in 1888 when  
our Lamented James G. Blaine  
ran for President of the U.S.
