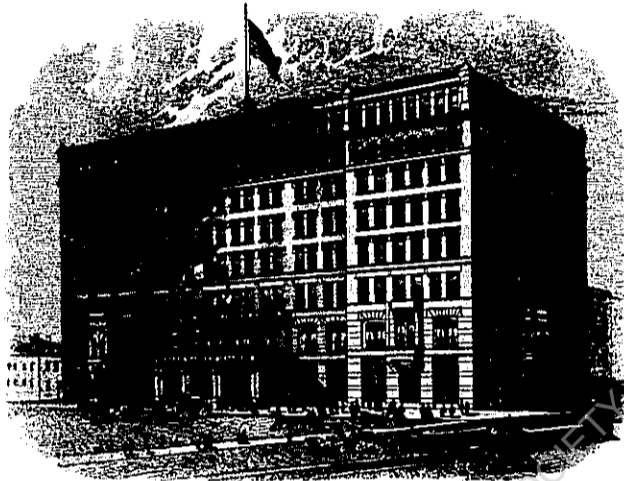

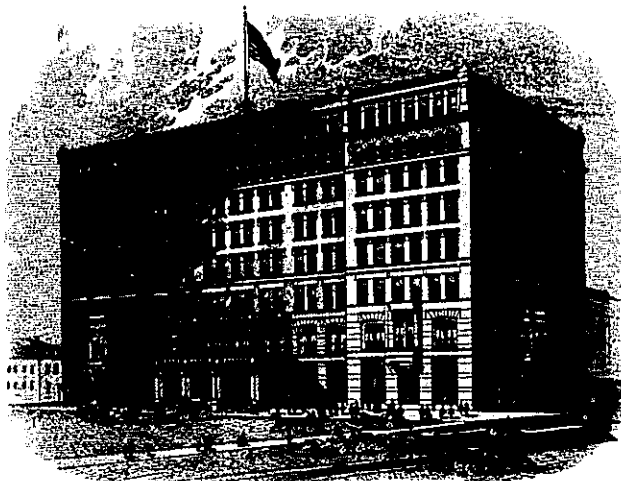
Had a pleasant time. Then lectured
