We have for many weeks been hard at work devising ways, means and plans for your enjoyment upon this occasion and we now lay before you the completed program of the exercises as arranged, knowing that the success of our efforts will depend upon your attendance.

By the kind assistance of the Faculty and Trustees we have added one day more to the program so that Class and Society reunions may have their proper share of time. An arrangement has also been made with all the leading lines of railroad for a reduction of fare making the cost but one and one-third fare for the round trip. The railroads named below are included in the Trunk Line and Central Traffic Associations and have agreed to the reduced rate of fare, (conditioned only upon an attendance of one hundred, while double that number are expected).

At any of the principal stations upon these lines, beginning Friday June 16th, upon paying full fare to Rochester you will receive a certificate entitling you to a return ticket for one-third fare. As soon as you arrive in Rochester please present this certificate to our Vice-President, Mr. Cronise, that it may be registered and viséd by the special agent here. When so viséd it will entitle you until Monday the 26th to a return ticket at the one-third rate. We advise applying at once to your nearest ticket agent on one of these lines so that if not supplied with certificates he may have time to get them.

Kindly notify Mr. Hair, the chairman of the Executive Committee, that you will be here, and let the Commencement of our University for 1893 be one memorable in her history.
