Long before Judge Tourgee published any articles in the Inter Ocean, this paper had established its reputation as a bold and strong advocate of all that is upright in the term radical republicanism. Judge Tourgee did not give tone to this paper, but his articles were accepted because they were in harmony with the policy of the paper. The intention was to discontinue the Notes last year but they were continued as a matter of convenience to all parties until August last. There is to be no change in the policy of the paper at all, and any man who insinuates that the Inter Ocean has abandoned the cause of justice, or has lost interest in the race problem owes the editor an apology.
