I have your letter and copy for the "Button's Inn" catalogue page. I was going to send it right off, but think, on the whole, it would be advisable if you could send me three or four brief extracts from leading papers, commending the book originally. I will wait for that.

The cost of these catalogue pages runs

from three to five dollars, according to the

amount of material in them. Of course if

there is much small type that counts up.

At all events five dollars would be the out
side, and the probability is it would be about

three, - that is for the electrotype plate

ready to print.

Then, as to the cost of paper and press

work and wiring, in the little pamphlet form, our last catalogue was fifty-six pages and cost \$51.00; so that undoubtedly \$1.00 for 2500 would cover the cost. In fact I don't see why you could not lump it all and say that \$5.00 would cover your advertising in this form, for an outside estimate.
