accept my thanks which I can not
express in words. You were so
thoughtful to send them, we could
not find lilies of the valley here and
they were so acceptable. We put
a bunch of the lilies in her room so
that she had perfumed them there
herself. It just seemed as if she
breathed. I can't write more
but you will surely know how
much I appreciate all your kindness

you can have I will not need it. It is in one of those sacks tucked
away & tucked. Just took my books and put my new palette in
it. And if I should take back with I had my sister
getting in the life classes again! Write soon and tell me my
beliefs. That long letter I wrote to mother she had not seen
and just the day before she had bought all my pictures
done from the artist and was going to have them framed
just the other afternoon she had addressed a paper to me and
was well at twelve o'clock that night. I can't realize it yet
I hope you are better and come better than she was.
It would be nice for your mother to stay with you I received such
a kind note from her. I had some pity for her business and all
but I do not know how I could have shared with out her will.

Tuesday morning. He had gone to
a bare bell garage when the telegram
came and started just as he was
with his strong clothes and shoes but
we are afraid he will be sick.

If I return I will come in about three
weeks or perhaps sooner I think that
will be best for me to get to work
again it is such a comfort to have some
thing to do. All my things use as if

enjoyment. I am not able to send you
anything now but I won't forget it
