We have your favor of July 23rd relative to bill for author's corrections, and in reply thereto beg to say that these charges for corrections do not include the charges made for corrections in resetting cuts. Those charges we paid ourselves. Mr. Philips, of Philips & Casey, claims that the changes in the text were so numerous as to amount almost to rewriting some parts of it. I do not see how we can determine this matter until the Judge is in condition to put Mr. Philips right in this matter if he is wrong. We have settled with Mr. Philips on this basis upon his assurance that he has kept accurate account of the time required to make these author's corrections, but if your husband can show that the charge is excessive we should be very glad to compel a reduction.
