We are in receipt of a letter from the American Express Co. of Mayville, N.Y. in which they say that the package which you left at their office to be shipped to us, was not shipped on account of non-prepayment of charges, and same was opened in the presence of two gentlemen to see if same would warrant charges, and was found to contain but $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of Chocolates instead of a full pound, as I supposed you would return. We do not understand it, as you certainly would not eat $\frac{3}{4}$ lb. of stale Chocolates, and it could not have been opened from the time it left your house until it reached the Express office.

This ~~this~~ has caused us considerable trouble, as it is the first complaint of stale Chocolates we have had, and we were very anxious to have the goods returned so that we might examine them ourselves, and see whether the candy was really stale, or whether the
