The sixty-third Annual Convention of Psi Upsilon will be held with the Phi Chapter, at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, May 6, 7, and 8, 1896. The Convention Dinner will be served in Detroit on the evening of May 8.

Many distinguished members, of whom we may now mention the Rev. Dr. Samuel Goodale, one of the original founders of the Fraternity; the Rt. Rev. William Stevens Perry, Bishop of Iowa; the Rt. Rev. G. Mott Williams, Bishop of Marquette; Dr. George H. Fox, of the Faculty of Columbia College; Professor Goldwin Smith, of the University of Toronto; the Hon. Lawrence Maxwell, ex-Solicitor General of the United States; Mr. Richard Hovey, the poet, and Mr. Charles W. Smiley, the editor of the great Psi Upsilon Catalogue of 1879, will attend and will take part in the convention. Professor Martin L. D'Ooge, LL. D., Dean of the Faculty of the University of Michigan, will deliver the address of welcome at the literary exercises. President Angell of the University will be one of the speakers. The Hon. Henry P. Field, Mayor of Northampton, Mass., will be the toastmaster at the convention dinner.

Large delegations from Chicago, Grand Rapids, Detroit, and other cities have made arrangements to attend the convention, and it is certain that more members will be present than have assembled at any similar gathering since 1892.

The Rho Chapter, recently installed in the University of Wisconsin, will be welcomed to the Fraternity, and the graduates of the Omega will be present to urge the recognition as a Chapter of the students recently initiated by them.

Every member of the Fraternity is invited to attend the convention. Comfortable accommodations at Ann Arbor may be secured at a very moderate expense. Reduced rates of fare on all railroads leading to Ann Arbor and Detroit, have been secured.
