Gentlemen:

We desire to acknowledge the receipt from you by freight of 78 volumes of the United States Reports, consisting of Curtis' Decisions, 22 volumes; Miller's Decisions, 4 volumes; Wallace's Reports, 23 volumes; United States Reports Volumes 91 to 111 both inclusive, 117, 123, 141, 145 to 150 inclusive; total 78 volumes.

Of these volumes, three, namely: Curtis, Volume 13, and Wallace, Volumes 15 and 17, were so badly damaged that it was necessary for us to send them to the bindery to be rebound. The two volumes of Wallace especially, had innumerable nail marks driven into the books, showing terribly poor packing. We have credited your account by \$64.00 for the 78 volumes, and have charged you with \$2.25 for the rebinding of the three injured volumes.
