Dear Mrs. Tourgée,

The body of our regretted friend arrived in Paris and was met this morning by Colonel Blanchard, 2nd Secretary of the Embassy, myself and secretary, Mr. Light. In our presence it was removed by the undertaker and his men from the railway van and placed in a funeral carriage with the flowers and taken to Père-la-Chaise for cremation. You will no doubt be hearing from the undertaker on the subject, as to the disposal of the ashes.

Now if there is anything further I can do for you please do not hesitate to let me know, and please tell the vice consul to communicate with me if he needs any information of any kind, such as we can help him with.

I was very much touched at the removal of the Judge's body this morning, and I again extend to you my sincere condolence.
