We shall be glad to consider the publication of an English edition of the late Mr. Albion Tourgee's works. We should also be glad of the following information as to publication:—

- (1) At what terms you could let us have printed sheets at per 100 and per 1000.

- (3) Whether you would be willing to let us have the moulds or stereo plates in preference to sheets if this seemed to us advisable.

We presume you will confine the sales of Mr. Tourgee's books to us on this side, should we undertake the publication of one or more.
